The History of Camp James E. Rudder: 6th Ranger Training Battalion

Camp James E. Rudder is the final stage of the nine-week course that starts at Fort Benning, Ga., and continues in the mountains of northern Georgia. After parachuting into Camp Rudder, the students spend 18 days learning jungle tactics, including stream crossings. The Ranger course is designed to develop military leaders who are physically and mentally tough and self-disciplined. It challenges them to think, act and react effectively in stress approaching that found in combat.

The Florida Ranger Camp was established November 15, 1951 by, then, MAJ Arthur "Bull" Simons who was named the Commander of the Amphibious/Jungle Training Committee at Auxiliary Field Seven, which was the initial location of the Camp. Colonel Simons was later the Commander of the prisoner of war rescue attempt on Son Tay, North Vietnam. The Florida Ranger Camp remained at Field 7 for 20 years until it was moved to Field 6 in January 1970.

In June 1974, the Florida Ranger Camp was officially renamed Camp James E. Rudder in honor of MG James E. Rudder, who commanded the 2d Ranger Battalion when it scaled the cliffs at Pointe Du Hoc, France, during the 1944 D-Day Normandy invasion.

The 6th Ranger Training Battalion's mission is to develop the leadership and combat functional skills of future ground combat leaders by making them conduct missions in a tactically realistic environment under physical and mental stresses that approach those found in combat. Included in the field training exercises are airborne and helicopter assaults, small boat operations, river crossings and swamp crossings. Leadership skills are taxed when conducting small unit operations in a simulated combat environment by the daily challenges students encounter including severe weather, swampy terrain, periods of sleep and food deprivation, mental and physical fatigue, as well as emotional stress. The 6th Ranger Training Battalion's parent organization is the Ranger Training Brigade located at FT Benning, Georgia.

Over the years, 22 students have died during the Eglin reservation phase of training. The worst accident was in February 1995 when four students died of hypothermia while on exercises in the swamps. The 1995 accident was blamed on several factors, including a sudden rise in the water level on Boiling Creek coupled with other unexpected weather changes, such as fog that delayed rescue efforts.

Since 1995, measures that are more sophisticated have been put into place that cast an elaborate, yet invisible, safety net around the students. As students plan ambushes and negotiate swamps, field ambulances are posted minutes away. Two evacuation helicopters and many rescue boats are on standby and are constantly advised of changing conditions. Before students enter the water, divers check out conditions. In addition, an elaborate system to monitor weather and water conditions and depths exists at every step in the exercise.

Training remains tough for the men who aspire to be the Army's most elite warriors. The Army has also placed more emphasis on protecting Rangers during training. Camp officials say that with lessons learned from a training accident in 1995, and more resources thanks to allocations from Congress, the danger of training casualties has been greatly reduced.

Camp Rudder (U.S. Army Ranger Camp) is near the intersection of Ranger Camp Road and Lewis Turner Boulevard, Ft. Walton Beach, Florida. Ranger Camp Road is 1.6 miles east of the traffic light at Lewis Turner Blvd., and Rte. 85, in the scenic woods of the Eglin AFB military reservation.

INPROCESSING PROCEDURES

FORT BENNING

The first step to in-processing is to report to the Welcome Center, BLDG 2602, Soldier's Plaza, and Fort Benning, GA. You must inprocess Fort Benning and Ranger Training Brigade before you report to 6th Ranger Training Battalion, Eglin Air Force Base. Do not make any attempts to purchase or lease a house in Florida until you have the BDE CSM's approval. Temporary lodging is available at Fort Benning for you and your family. It is important you save all your receipts to claim TLE once you arrive at 6th RTBn.

The Fort Benning in/out processing and Replacement Operations focuses on the installation clearance procedures and individual Soldier readiness verification for assigned Soldiers. AG organizes the various installation agencies needed to welcome and depart permanent party Soldiers and their Families from Fort Benning. Initial installation sign-in and replacement center support are operational 24 hours daily at Building 2607, 706-545-3608. Upon arrival to the Replacement Center between 0600-0800 hours, it is necessary to be in uniform as in processing will start that day. If anytime after 0800 hours, uniform is not necessary and in processing will start the following morning unless it is a weekend or holiday.

Upon arrival at the Replacement Operations Center, each Soldier is asked a list of questions which will result in them receiving a "tailored" inprocessing checklist. This "tailored" checklist will require them to inprocess only those optional agencies which are applicable to their needs. There are a total of ten (10) optional inprocessing agencies and twelve (12) mandatory agencies.

During the first full day of in processing, all soldiers attend a 4 hour session that involves briefings given by DENTAC, MEDPROS, Occupational Health, Health Promotions, Pinnacle (Post Housing), Finance, ACS/DMWR, Drug and Alcohol, and Better Opportunities for Single Soldiers (BOSS). TRICARE inprocessing will be conducted when you arrive at Eglin AFB. You will need to handcarry your Dental records to Camp Rudder. They will be maintained at 6th RTB. Your medical records will need to be sent to 6th RTB, hand carried if possible.

There is a mandatory safety briefing that every Soldier must attend. The safety briefing is held on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at

Upon completion of these sessions, Soldiers proceed to complete other inprocessing requirements identified on their "tailored" checklist. All inprocessing agencies are located in Soldier's Plaza and are within walking distance. Overall, it takes on average of 3 days to complete the Fort Benning installation inprocessing.

Other in processing requirements will be conducted at the unit of assignment (i.e., Central Issue Facility, Security Clearance, Government Credit Cards,etc.).

Upon arrival at the Replacement Center, there are several items that will be necessary to get started. They are the following:

- PCS Orders and any amendments
- DA 31 (Leave Form)
- Latest OER/NCOER
- Personnel File (201 File)
- Latest enlistment contract
- Service Group Life Insurance (SGLI)
- DD Form 93 (Record of Emergency Data)
- DA Form 1059 (Service School Academic Evaluation Report) if applicable
- Physical Profile (P3 or P4)

CIF is only open on Monday and Thursday between the hours of 0800 to 1100 for issue. The quickest way to in-process Fort Benning is to arrive on a Tuesday or a Wednesday. Otherwise you will remain at Fort Benning until fully in-processed. You are required to do all the in-process at Fort Benning even if you're not going to use their facilities. Example, housing. You must in-process Fort Benning housing so they can stamp off on your in-processing checklist. Average in-processing time for Fort Benning is 3 - 5 days.

Guest Housing: Fort Benning Guest House offers 1100 attractive, affordable rooms for you and your family. Each accommodation offers useful amenities you will not find at most other lodging facilities in the area such as Security card system and Handicap suites. Prices range from \$28 to \$60 per night and may accommodate from 4 to 6 guests. Reservations can be made 3 days prior to your stay based upon space availability. Those with PCS orders have priority and may make advance reservations. Check in time is 2 p.m. and not later than 6 p.m. After 6 p.m., rooms are available on a first come basis. Reservations can be made over the phone or at Olsen Hall (Bldg 399). Reservations must be made with a credit card. Guests and family members may qualify for billeting privileges at the Gavin House on Fort Benning. They can determine their billeting eligibility by calling the Fort Benning Billeting Office at (706) 689-0067.

Pets & Relocation: Fort Benning does not have on-post boarding facilities for pets; however, there are approximately 12 kennels in the local area, several with in/outdoor facilities & pick-up and delivery.

Upon completion of in processing the Welcome Center, you will be given an additional set of orders further assigning you to 6th Ranger Training Battalion, Camp James E. Rudder, Eglin AFB, Florida. You will need to inprocess the Ranger Training Brigade Headquarters before leaving Fort Benning.

RANGER TRAINING BRIGADE HQ

Once you have completed the Soldier's Plaza portion of your in-processing report to the Ranger Training Brigade, BLDG 5024, for the next steps of in-processing. Point of contact at Ranger Training Brigade is the Personnel Sergeant at (706) 544-6014 or Staff Duty at (706) 544-6980.

Before traveling to 6th Ranger Training Battalion, soldiers should make use of the three day travel time allotted by taking care of any personal matters and purchasing required items that are available at Benning. These include getting sewing done on the uniforms, buying and sewing on the black and gold unit flash for the beret, buying black Jump Boots for the class A uniform, and purchasing PT uniforms. Make sure you get your name tapes and cat eyes sewn on your assault pack, MOLLE ruck, and web gear. The PT uniform for all TABBED personnel is the black "Ranger" sweatshirt/sweat bottom and black "Ranger" T-shirt/short. During the wintertime, the Army black skullcap and black gloves are also required. All black uniform tops will have white name tapes with your rank and last name (last name only for SPC and below) sewn above the tab or centered on the chest. These items can be purchased at Military Clothing on post or at Ranger Joe's and Commando's off post. During the Fort Benning in processing, you will receive a CIF appointment. Be sure to draw your CIF items before you leave Fort Banning. Specific information can be obtained from Brigade S-1 before departing for 6th Ranger Training Battalion.

6TH RTB AND EGLIN AFB

After completing Ranger Training Brigade in-processing the following items should be on your person when in-processing Camp James E. Rudder:

1. Two copies of orders assigning you to Fort Benning
2. Two copies of orders assigning you to 6th Ranger Training Battalion
3. Two copies of your NCOER/OER, if applicable
4. Two copies of your DA Form 2-1/ERB/officers (ORB)
5. Education Records, if applicable
6. Medical and Dental Records
7. Copy of DA Form 348 (Military Driver's License) and DDC Card

Upon arriving to 6th Ranger Training Battalion report to the Battalion S-1, BLDG 29, for further assignment within the Battalion. During in-processing at Eglin AFB, you will have to enroll in TRICARE South Region at BLDG 2793 (850) 883-8246, behind the Eglin Hospital.

If you have any questions about on or off post housing, please feel free to call 6th RTB for Rudderville (Camp Rudder Housing Area) availability or the Eglin Housing Office at (850) 882-4533. The housing office will be one of your first stops after signing in to 6th RTB. The housing office will provide you with a housing packet outlining the housing requirements while assigned here. If you choose to live in Rudderville (Camp Rudder Housing Area) or Eglin Base Housing, you must tell the 6th RTB S-1 during in processing in order to stop your BAH. For any other kind of information, call 6th RTB PAC at (850) 882-2403.

TRICARE ENROLLMENT PORTABILITY

A feature of TRICARE Prime allows active duty families the opportunity to transfer their healthcare coverage from one TRICARE contractor region to another.

WHEN LEAVING YOUR CURRENT LOCATION

- If your family members are in TRICARE Prime, **DO NOT DISENROLL**. Remain enrolled at your current location while you are enroute to Camp Rudder. Disenrollment before you move, it will cause a gap in your TRICARE Prime coverage and you will be responsible for the bills. You can call TRICARE South Region at (800) 444-5445 and have a transfer form sent to you prior to PCS'ing or pick one up at TMC 12 upon arrival to Camp Rudder.
- If you have an existing medical condition that may need immediate attention in your new region, such as pregnancy or a chronic illness, please contact the South Region TRICARE contractor in advance to expedite PCM selection and records transfer, (800) 444-5445.
- Make sure you have an adequate supply of your prescriptions. Filling prescriptions in advance of your move will help you avoid the need to purchase the prescription and then file a claim for reimbursement while all systems are being updated with your enrollment change. Follow the existing guidelines regarding non-emergency care authorizations. (Call your Primary Care Manager (PCM) **at previous station** for authorizations should you need care during your move).
- Always present identification with your current Prime contractor's information to the provider when obtaining care. If you already have a TRICARE Prime identification card, present this. If your enrollment is in process, present a copy of your enrollment application. Supplying the provider with this information at the time of service will minimize the likelihood of claim payment delays and confusion.

UPON ARRIVAL AT YOUR NEW LOCATION

- It is **mandatory** for all active duty soldiers to apply for TRICARE. While in-processing the battalion, all active duty personnel will report to the TRICARE Service Center and TRICARE element co-located in the TRICARE building behind the Eglin hospital to receive their TRICARE Prime Remote application. You may also call the TRICARE Service Center at 1-800-444-5445 for assistance and information, as well as TRICAREonline.com for information and scheduling appointments, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Civilian health care providers provide health care for active duty personnel.
- Transfer your family members' enrollment as soon as you arrive at Camp Rudder. (**Do not wait until you need care to turn in your application**).
- While in-processing at Camp Rudder, complete an enrollment/transfer application and choose a new Primary Care Manager (PCM). When completing the enrollment or transfer form, make sure you note on the application that you are using the "**transfer**" option (if you were enrolled in Prime elsewhere).
- Your enrollment transfer will be coordinated by the new contractor with the former contractor and is effective the day the new contractor receives your completed enrollment application. However, it may take up to 2 - 3 weeks for your PCM selection to be validated, your new Prime identification card to be issued, and your records to be updated in all systems. (**Keep a copy of the enrollment form you have completed in case you need care – this form serves as your temporary identification as a Prime member**).
- If you have submitted your new application, but have not yet received your TRICARE identification card confirming your PCM selection, we suggest that you verify receipt of your

application and determine your PCM assignment before obtaining non-emergency health care. This will help reduce the risk of incurring higher Point-of-Service costs for seeking

Family Members: Dialing 911 at the first sign of an emergency is important because it puts you in contact with the fastest and most beneficial mode of transportation to an emergency facility.

The Emergency Department is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, to ensure acute patient treatment in a timely manner.

Routine patients are seen in the order they enter the department.



Camp Rudder Family Housing Floor-plans




